- An update on the Mayor's Infrastructure Plan 2050 -

We are living in exciting times for London – described as the financial, commercial, cultural, artistic, media and scientific capital of the world, it is projected to reach over 11 million inhabitants by mid-century, a 37 per cent increase from 2011.

This brings huge opportunities and challenges in equal measure:

- How can we maintain and enhance London's competitiveness and liveability whilst accommodating population growth?
- Where can and should we accommodate this growth?
- What new infrastructure do we need?
- How can we make best use of existing infrastructure and innovation?
- How do we fund it?

To meet these challenges head on the Mayor has published a London Infrastructure Plan 2050. It is a strategic attempt to state exactly what infrastructure London needs, roughly how much it will cost and how we can do it in the best possible way. It is currently in consultation until 31st October 2014.

Isabel Dedring will give an update on the plan's progress and how we can make all this a reality, with a particular focus on transport.
